

KJH Community Council Minutes February 8, 2022

Malia Roundy welcomed community council; Emily Arrington motioned to approve January Minutes, Sara Lundberg seconded the motion, all voting members approved minutes including, Malia Roundy, Sara Lundberg, Jennifer Matthews, Yvette VanDyke, Emily Arrington, Michael Martini, Jennifer Coyle.

Counselor Yvette VanDyke reports registration is underway, 7th & 8th graders received packets in class and will enter the schedule request in DSD during English 8 and CCA. Packets will go out to 6th grade before the February 17th open house. Counselors will visit elementaries starting February 24th.

February 10th is the honors social at lunch for students receiving a certificate of high honor roll and improvements.

JSSC Jennifer Coyle reports that Parent Teacher Conference is in person next week on February 16th, the 6th Grade Open House is on February 17th. Teachers will continue to reinforce wearing badges. The protocol for devices is for students to bring devices, or call home, as a last resort they will check out a second device to be returned to the media center at the end of the day.

Teachers survived online teaching the first three days of the term, many commented that it went well but is never as good as face to face. The Canvas platform is used for consistency. Midterms are February 11.

Student Government Cruz Rushton reported the students did okay with online but prefer in person learning. Girls' basketball has ended, candy gram sales are underway, Wrestling and track are the upcoming events. SBO's are planning a Mid-March dance.

Budget Report included each goal progress. GOAL 1, Passing rate for 1st term was met by 7th grade and 9th grade. 2nd Term met only by 7th grade.

GOAL 2, is for higher level thinking taught by teachers and observed by administration in classrooms. So far this year teachers are at 2.48 out of 4. The goal is 2.61. Mr. Martini noted that he will consider adjusting this goal next year as 2.61 was the average for the last four years and may need to be closer aligned somewhere between 2.48 and 2.61.

GOAL 2 is reading enrichment, This goal is measured by benchmarks throughout the year from testing in English classes. 7th Grade have some resources in place including Read 180, Co taught classes including SPED, and Enrichment reading for all 7th grade and some 8th & 9th grade students.

March 8th will be an A/B Day for 9th grade ACT Practice test. The schedule will be adjusted for that day.

Trustlands funding is on schedule as planned. Next year goals will be prepared for next CC meeting. Next years computer purchases will be NOVA instead of DELL as the price of DELL has increased significantly.

Mr. Martini is working with Davis High Principal Gregory Wilkie. They are hoping to employ a social worker to share between the two schools. Students will have access to the same social worker for six years.

Parent questioned how bathroom accommodation will look in the future as the schools are required to comply with all gender identities.

A search is on for a new superintendent. Mr. Martini encouraged all community council member to have voice in that process.
